REPORT OF THE CHAIR For the Year Ended 30 April 2019

A good year overall for the Sports Club; as well as some of our traditional events such as the volleyball, Halloween etc the introduction of the Lashings event and a Gin and Ale festival provided the club with a great opportunity to increase awareness of our fantastic sports ground and facilities. Membership has remained generally static although with some fluctuations over the Sections.

There have been many notable sporting achievements including great success in Hockey with both the Mens and Ladies teams being promoted to the National League and in Cricket the 1st team won the County Cup. The Squash 1st team won their cup and were runners up in the league. Also, Keith Timms has been named England over 35s captain and Amber Marshall reached number 2 in the country in women's racketball and won the East of England racketball tournament. Tennis saw a growth of 32 members (12%) on the previous year's figure. Adult membership has gone up by 28 members (19%) largely due to the arrangement with Ponsbourne Tennis Club to offer their members a temporary home while they look for new premises.

Our club could not operate without our small group of permanent staff and our great bar team. I would like to offer my sincere thanks to all of them:

- Our Administration Manager Teresa Weedon
- Our bar team led by Jill Marshall who, despite some challenges, continue to provide a high
 quality, professional service, stepping up when required and representing the club in the
 best way possible to visiting teams and their supporters.
- Our ground team of Dave Gadsden, Jamie O'Sullivan and Ray Watkins have done an
 exceptional job keeping the pitches, astroturf, tennis courts and the surroundings
 immaculate throughout the year. Many visiting teams, including the professionals within the
 Lashings team, have been very complimentary about our ground which is testament to the
 job carried out by Dave, Jamie and Ray.
- Also, Karen has again provided BBQs throughout the year and kept all our sections teams fed during their respective league seasons.

During the last year, financially, we have had to work hard to stay level. Essential repairs to the club house, which are not always visible to members but are vital to keeping the facilities usable, have needed to be completed which created a spike in building maintenance costs. Work carried out included new doors, NICC electrical testing and new shower pumps which all needed replacing or completing. Bar takings were down during 18/19 and we have had a close look at the month on month figures to try to address our declining revenues in this area. This year we are running more events throughout the year to try to redress the balance of costs versus income and are looking to make improvements to the bar area.

The committee are always looking at ways in which the club can raise more funds focussing mainly on the weekday hours to try to increase rentals. The introduction of walking football has been a great success with more sessions being planned. We are also looking for any opportunity that will provide a capital injection to allow us to plan some more ambitious development of the clubhouse; to that end we sent out a note to members on a possible new gym being built on the Tennis pavilion site operating as a shared facility. This project has unfortunately not progressed beyond the planning phase and has dropped away. We will continue to look at all possibilities to try to get some of our big-ticket items such as the car park resurfacing funded.

Members will have noticed we are on a fund-raising drive to provide disabled access and facilities at the club and we regard this as a very important project. We must become a more inclusive club and by getting a lift installed and changing/toilet facilities in the clubhouse we can start to host a range of disabled sports. Fund raising is going well and we have had some quotes for the first phase which is the lift. We will keep the members informed of plans and progress.

The focus of the committee during the next financial year will be to continue to deliver a great sporting facility, whilst developing a longer-term plan for creating the revenues required to enhance both our club house, the outside areas and the expansion of sports on offer. We will also continue to improve our communications; work has been done in this area on social media and on our website. The primary issue we are tackling is in encouraging people to use the channels available.

I would like to thank all members for their support and for getting involved in organising club functions; several of our events would not happen without the efforts of volunteers from the membership.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow committee members for their selfless commitment and hard work in what at times can be a thankless task. If you would like to get involved in shaping the future of this great club, the nominations forms will be on the notice board ahead of the AGM.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 April 2019

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoiced sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Depreciation

Assets purchased are wherever possible charged against the surplus for the year, and are accordingly written off, without depreciation being required. Any grants received are taken into income in the year of receipt. In addition, a transfer of trading surplus is made to sinking funds, to facilitate the future replacement of major assets. When the replacement expenditure is incurred, the appropriate amount is transferred from the sinking fund to income in the year in which the expenditure is incurred.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

2 TAXATION

No liability to UK corporation tax arose on ordinary activities for the year ended 30 April 2019 nor for the year ended 30 April 2018.
