REPORT OF THE CHAIR for the Year Ended 30 April 2022

The last year 2021/22, we progressively moved out of the Covid regulations initially reopening on the 12th of April; this was the start of a new phase for the club with the new outside area opening thanks to the efforts of a large team of volunteers directed by our builder, Russ. This area has been a huge success throughout the summer and on bright days in the winter.

The impact of the progressive covid changes meant the club and our members had to adapt frequently as the rules and guidelines changed. I thank you all for your patience and, most importantly, your flexibility in accepting and adhering to the changes made to the operating processes within the club throughout this period, a notable moment being the sit-down Gin Festival, an interesting challenge but not one I want to repeat!!

The Committee's primary focus has again been on the safety of our members and staff, whilst making sure that we stay financially stable throughout what has been a very testing time.

The financial stability of the club was helped massively during this period by the loyalty demonstrated by our members, continuing to pay memberships and returning to our sports as soon as each section was allowed. Finding our way through Government, Council and Sporting bodies' respective interpretations of rules and guidelines has been at times difficult but through the support of each sections' committees we were ready to go at every opportunity in every sport where and when we were allowed. All sections are bouncing back well with some very notable achievements; three of our cricket teams were promoted last season and Amber Marshall became the UK Racquetball Series Champion. Section reports will be shared as part of the AGM and these will provide more details.

The positive approaches to promoting the club being made by all sections in their respective committees is reaping rewards with good progress in all sports. Our sections continue to thrive with the juniors in Cricket, Hockey, and Tennis all very strong and growing in Squash and Racketball. A big welcome to our new Ladies Cricket team that have played their inaugural season for the club this year. Continual development driven by good coaching is a key factor in retaining our juniors, broadening our teams and, as such, ensuring a bright future.

The coaching programmes across the sections are continually improving and the utilisation of social media is keeping everyone informed and engaged. A big thank you to all our coaches across Cricket, Hockey, Tennis and Squash/Racketball for their efforts and in particular the army of volunteers that help them manage the junior teams and sessions.

We organised several events during the year which started with a challenging Gin Festival with no dancing and then, when we fully opened in July, with a highly successful return of the Lashings Touring Cricket team. I would like to thank all the volunteers who stepped forward to organise these events. Social events make a huge difference to the dynamics of the club both by bringing people together and generating much needed income and it is encouraging that the sections are organising events that are open to all and making the club a much more integrated environment.

Club Employees

Our club could not operate without our small group of permanent staff and our great bar team. I would like to offer my sincere thanks to all of them:

- Our Administration Manager Teresa Weedon
- Our bar team led by Jill Marshall who continue to provide a high quality, professional service, stepping up when required and representing the club in the best way possible to visiting teams and their supporters and coping with all the changes we have had to make throughout the year.
- Our grounds team of Dave Gadsden, Jamie O'Sullivan and Ray Watkins have done an exceptional job keeping the pitches, the AstroTurf, tennis courts and the surroundings immaculate throughout the year. Visiting teams including the professionals have been very complimentary about our grounds and facilities, which is testament to the job carried out by Dave, Jamie and Ray.
- Karen has again provided BBQs throughout the year and kept all our sections' teams fed, when allowed, during their respective league seasons.

Club Development

- The creation of the outside area has been a huge success and provided welcome income when needed; members were able to enjoy
 a level of normality with lighting and heating. It has created a focal point, helped us attract new members and provided a much
 more pleasant experience for everyone.
- 2) We exchanged contracts in late 2021 with Game 4 Padel and at the time of writing the Padel courts are up and running with a new thriving membership group within the club; thanks to Sarah Elliot for getting this project to where it is now and the volunteers who have stepped forward to take on the key roles in getting us organised and leading the Padel membership group.
- 3) The disabled access project has been progressing; the new lift is being installed, the toilet facility will soon be complete and at long last we will have access and facilities for all at the club.
- 4) Tennis courts 9 and 10 were refurbished with new tiger turf surfaces installed and new LED floodlights have been put in on courts 5 to 10.

Future Development

Despite the impact of the pandemic and cost of living issues we continue to work on planning future developments at the club. These can be divided into two distinct categories:

 Club restructuring- We have done a lot of work in the background this year on restructuring the club. This has become necessary as firstly our trust holders Barclays have changed their business model and no longer provide this service. Secondly, HMRC have changed the rules regarding how Community Amateur Sports Clubs record their accounts splitting members' and non-members' income.

We formed a subcommittee to address this issue and they have investigated what the optimum operating model for the club should be considering the changes above and what benefits any prospective future model brings. We are working through the options now and will issue further briefings during the coming year leading to an EGM where we will present the proposed changes and the recommendation for approval.

2) Developing the club infrastructure and sporting facilities

The focus of the committee moving through this year will be to focus on developing the clubhouse, we have invested over the last few years on the sporting facilities and will maintain all our great pitches and courts, but the clubhouse now needs some improvements.

There is currently a study underway to investigate the options open to us within the current infrastructure and is also looking at some more radical schemes. Clearly cost and time are the key factors in decision making on changes, when the committee have a recommendation, we will make that to the club either through open meetings or, if needed, an EGM.

Going Forward

The focus of the Committee during this next fiscal year will be to navigate our way through whatever constraints the pandemic and cost of living crisis creates and continue to deliver a great sporting facility. We will continue developing a longer-term plan for driving revenues required to enhance our club house, the outside areas, and the expansion of sports on offer. We will also continue to improve our communications; work has been done in this area on social media and on our website and we are investigating how we get all the respective sports communities more joined up; the primary issue we are tackling is in encouraging people to use the options available.

Finally, I would like to thank my fellow Committee members for their selfless commitment and hard work in what at times can be a thankless task. If you would like to get involved in shaping the future of such a great club, nominations forms will be available on the notice boards and website during the AGM period.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 30 April 2022

ACCOUNTING POLICIES 1.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Turnover

Turnover represents net invoices sales of goods, excluding value added tax.

Tangible fixed assets

Assets purchased are wherever possible charged against the surplus for the year, and are accordingly written off, without depreciation being required. Any grants received are taken into the income in the year of receipt. In addition, as transfer of trading surplus is made to sinking funds, to facilitate the future replacement of major assets. When the replacement expenditure is incurred, the appropriate amount is transferred from the sinking fund to income in the year in which the expenditure is incurred.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.
